Line Flushing

The Town Foreman intends to complete flushing the water and sewer lines. The process will cause infrequent shut offs, higher than usual turbidity as well as pressure issues occasionally. This process is a necessary activity for the safe operation of our utility. We apologize for any inconvenience. The entire flushing process will be done over a two to three week period, so you may encounter these problems for a few weeks.

This means that the cost of installation of water and sewer lines in the new development will be assisted by the Federal and Provincial Governments for 2/3 of the costs. This will enable Allan to move forward on this project quickly. Expect to be seeing water and sewer lines installed before winter.
