Doctor Avinashi

The doctor is scheduled to be working in Allan on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month in the morning - he starts at 9:00 a.m. To make appointments on regular days, call 257-3350 starting at 8:30 a.m. He will be in on June 11 and June 25. Please make use of our new doctor. We are currently on a trial basis, to see if enough patients will be using his services in Allan to make this a permanent situation. Your support is needed to continue to have a doctor coming to town on a long term basis.

All Terrain Vehicle Regulations

Spring brings out the bikes and ATVs, here is a reminder of the rules regarding the operation of these vehicles. ATVs are allowed in Town, however they are subject to the ATV Act. You may drive them in town, between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 11:00 p.m., provided as follows:

- You have a valid drivers' license, and are wearing a helmet. All others are prohibited from driving ATVs on public property.

As for Dirt Bikes - unless

you have a motorcycle license, and your bike is "Street Legal" these vehicles should not be driven on streets and roads.

Also, another reminder, areas like the canals north of town and golf course are public property - therefore, they are to be considered the same as streets and roads for the above provisions.

Fire Departments and First Responders Need Your Help to Help You

They are reminding everyone to have your house number installed, and have it visible from the street. Please make sure your house number is installed on the front of your home, clearly visible and is lit when you are calling for help. Light your house up like a Christmas Tree, if necessary, but make sure you are easy to find.

The last thing you need if someone is having a heart attack is to meet them at the store, car wash or hotel to get them to your home. We do have an AED and Allan is a heartsafe community. The first responders all have kits and will be coming from their homes, you will increase response time if you do not have your house number visible from the street. Remember, you might be the victim, and your friends, neighbours, relatives or children could be calling for help.

When you dial 9-1-1 your address is displayed on the screen as where you are calling from. i.e. if you are calling from the town office, it would show 224 Main Street. However, it is always a good idea to have your address posted beside your telephone. If you are rural, the land description from your land telephone line is displayed. Cell phones do not have a location, but would display the nearest cell phone tower location. It is always best to call for help from a land line in a medical emergency.
